You're leading the way for CHILDREN & FAMILIES

BECAUSE EVERY CHILD DESERVES A STRONG START AND A BRIGHT FUTURE.

THE PROBLEM:

3 out of 5 of Vermont's youngest children don't have access to the child care they need.

THE SOLUTION:

Thanks to you, our staff provide direct support to child care programs statewide. Through grants and expert coaching, we worked with 24% of all child care programs in Vermont in 2019.

THAT'S 803 NEW & IMPROVED

IN 2019, YOU HELPED PROVIDE:

- 415 new child care spaces
- CHILD CARE SPACES • 388 high-quality child care spaces
- 245 child care programs statewide with free technical assistance and support from our staff
- \$401,849 directly to 20 child care programs to expand their capacity and improve their quality

WHAT IS A CHILD CARE SPACE?

A child care "space" refers to an early educator caring for an infant, toddler, or preschooler during one day or night. We use spaces to track the availability of child care. Not every family needs child care for a full day, so many spaces are shared between families who use part-time child care.



YOUR SUPPORT AT WORK

In 2019, inspired by Vermonters like you calling for public investments in child care, the State of Vermont allocated \$2.2M to help child care programs build more spaces and improve their quality.

Let's Grow Kids was honored to have been chosen to implement those public funds, beginning in 2020, alongside your generous philanthropic support.

In 2020, we will use those state dollars to expand our grantmaking—to create more child care for Vermont families, sooner.

SPOTLIGHT ON SUCCESS

Georgia's Next Generation GEORGIA, VERMONT

Sara LeBlanc, an experienced early educator, started dreaming about creating Georgia's Next Generation—a child care center to serve her community—in March 2018.

For several months, Sara and her husband Dan worked tirelessly to make her dream into a reality: they found and rented a former pizza shop on a busy commuter road and transformed it into a high-quality child care for eight infants and 10 preschoolers.

But the need in Georgia, and in Franklin County, was greater than Sara could provide. "On average, we see 4-5 inquiries a day," she says.

Sara reached out to Jen Severance, a Let's Grow Kids staff member, for help expanding her child care program. Together, they created a proposal to add 24 new child care spaces.

Thanks to your generosity, Jen has been working with Sara every step of the way, from the planning stages to crossing the finish line.

In addition to Jen's technical assistance, Sara and Georgia's Next Generation received a grant of \$27,000 through our Make Way for Kids program to help fund their expansion.

Today, Georgia's Next Generation's 42 child care spaces are full, and the program still has a waitlist. Because of your support, and lots of hard work, Sara and her team transformed Georgia from a child care desert into a child care resource.

WHAT IS MAKE WAY FOR KIDS?

Since 2018, we've helped child care programs add 1,304 high-quality spaces for Vermont's children through this program.

EARLY EDUCATORS ARE LEADERS FOR CHANGE.

THE PROBLEM:

Early educators make a median of \$29,430 yearly, often without benefits.

There are approximately 7,000 early educators in Vermont.* But to fill the gaps for children and families who need child care, we'll need an additional 2,090 people to join this workforce.

THE SOLUTION:

High-quality early educators make child care possible.

IN 2019. YOU HELPED:

- 136 early educators pursuing teacher licensure get assistance and support from Let's Grow Kids staff
- Child care programs create 98 new jobs across Vermont





YOUR SUPPORT AT WORK

Thanks to you, the Let's Grow Kids staff works with high schools, career and technical centers, and higher education partners to inspire learners to make early childhood education their profession. We also partner with colleges and professional organizations so that early educators can continue to hone their skills, gain credentials, and earn degrees.

What is advancing as a recognized profession?

Vermont's early educators are uniting both statewide and nationally to define and lead their profession. In 2019, 715 early educators participated in this work with Let's Grow Kids and the Vermont Association for the Education of Young Children.

My Second Home

BRADFORD. VERMONT

Meri Carpenter-Saladino is an early educator and a lifelong learner. She has been running My Second Home, a high-quality licensed family child care program in Bradford, for 32 years. In 2019, Meri was honored as Vermont's Early Educator of the Year—because of her professional commitments and her heartfelt commitment to our children.

Meri was drawn to the profession because she saw that she could offer support to families and children in her community.

But Meri also understands the great responsibility she has as an early educator. She has worked hard over many years to earn her college degrees. And with support from Let's Grow Kids and lots of hard work, Meri earned her Vermont early educator teacher license.

In her words, "Continuing education is mandatory. If you don't do professional development and training, you aren't doing justice to the children. If we don't take trainings [on trauma, on special needs], we're not serving them."

Meri knows, too, that she's not alone in her dedication to the early learners in her program. Meri is a leader among her peers and colleagues. "Many of us work with children and families 50+ hours a week. We wake up in the night strategizing ways to help. It takes all of us. That is why this award is not about me, it's about we."

Thank you, Meri, for upholding excellence as an early childhood educator and leader.

SPOTLIGHT ON SUCCESS

In 2019, the Vermont Legislature and Governor Phil Scott invested a historic \$8.8M in the state budget for new ways to support child care and early educators.

THIS WAS A 30% INCREASE IN STATE FUNDING FOR CHILD CARE— THE LARGEST INCREASE OUR STATE HAS SEEN.

This didn't happen by accident. It happened because you shared your story. Because you lent your voice to this movement. Because you shared the vision that you have for our state—to be one where our children can live up to their fullest potential, become thoughtful and engaged citizens, and help build our shared future.

The state's child care investments received unanimous, tri-partisan support in the Vermont House of Representatives—an unprecedented showing of support. Securing this money in the state budget means a lot.

- More high-quality child care programs will be able to open and expand.
- Early educators will get more support to advance as a profession






